praising God and saying:

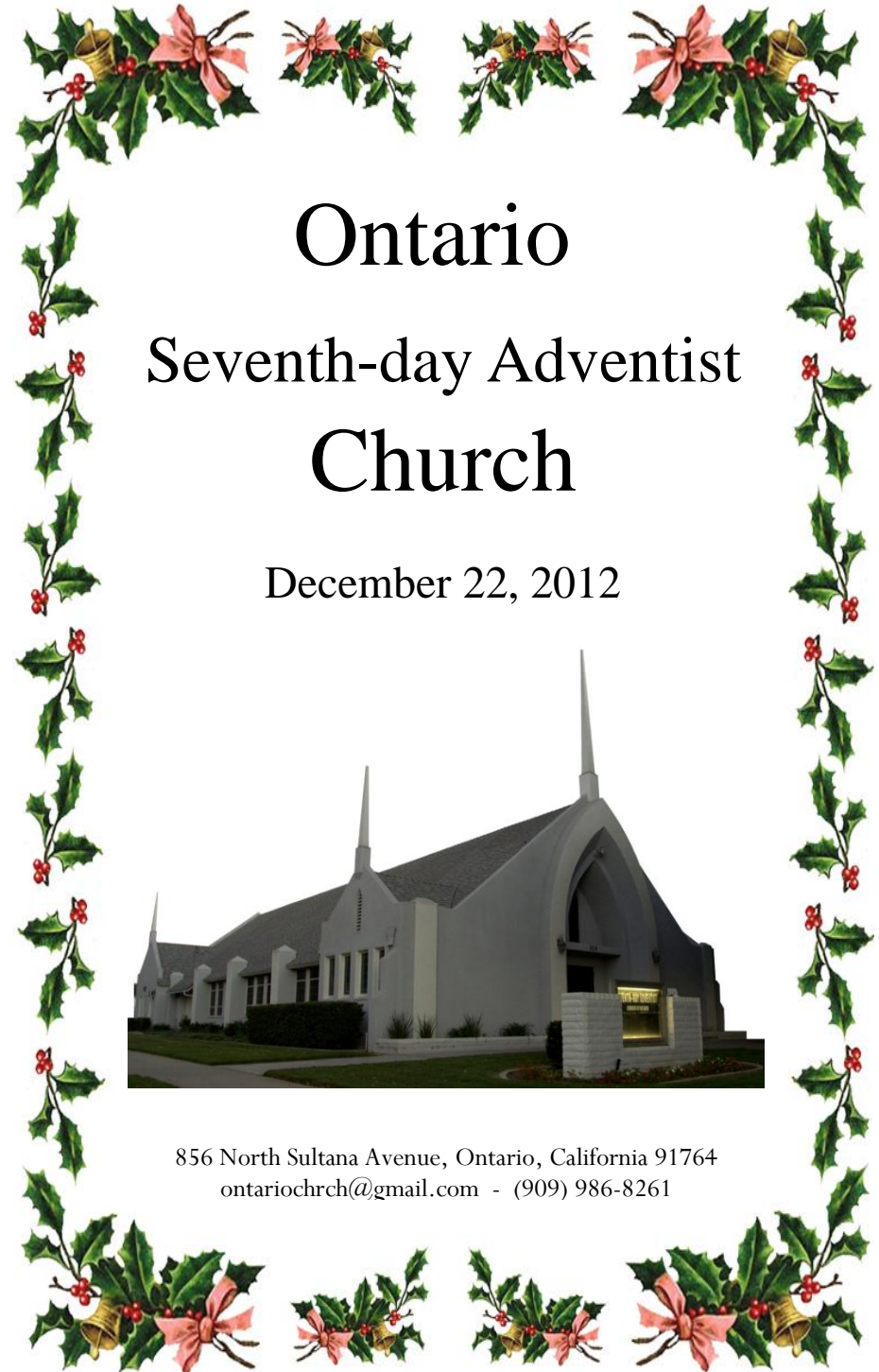
"Glory to God in the highest,
