January and February, 2013, have **Marched** on and we are into it already!

What has been the main focus of your life? Have you been preoccupied with just life-sustaining activities, or has there been some determined spiritual growth?

Do you remember the sermon you heard a few weeks back, "**Grow in Grace**?" You received an insert in your bulletin—a Self-Evaluation Profile—to measure your spiritual growth. Have you take the time to work on it? If not, I challenge you to pull it out and work on it.

Here's a practical way to measure your spiritual growth. Pick up one or two items from the Self-Evaluation Profile and ask the Lord to help you grow in those areas. Ask yourself these questions:

1. On a scale of 1–10; 1=the lowest and 10=the highest; where do you feel you are at, 5 being the mid-point?
2. In the next few weeks or months where do you want to move that number to: for example moving from 5 to 7 or 8?
3. What would it take for you to move that number to 7, 8 or 9?
4. Revisit these chosen growth areas often for measuring growth.

Growing spiritually is a determined choice you make and it will take some hard work. But when you ask the lord for wisdom to do it, His promise is: "**If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all liberally, and without reproach, and it will be given him**" James 1:5. Let this month be a Happy March for you.
